LABOUR WELFARE CENTRES : SCHEME FOR THE BENEFITS OF CHILDREN OF INDUSTRIAL WORKERS/EMPLOYEES

OBJECTIVES:

A Scheme to open the Labour Welfare Centres was launched by the Government of Goa in 1969 to impart training in Embroidery Cutting and Tailoring. Since then a chain of Labour Welfare Centres were opened throughout the State. The Government however, recently after the report of the work study has banned further opening of the L.W.C's. The requirement however from the areas with labour concentration continues. To meet the requirements of the Industrial class, the Board considered it expedient to start its own scheme.

MODALITIES FOR OPERATION OF THE SCHEME

1. Syllabus of the scheme shall be designed on the course conducted by the Office of the Commissioner, Labour & Employment and the State Directorate of Craftsmen's Training.
2. Appointment of Sewing Mistress shall be on Part-Time basis / Daily Wages / Regular Basis depending upon the needs and circumstances.
3. Timing of the L.W.C's shall be from 9.30 am to 1.15 pm, (Morning Batch) and 2.00 p.m. to 5.45 p.m (Evening Batch).
4. Admission in the Labour Welfare Centre shall be restricted to the children of Industrial workers-employees. However, children of Government servants including teachers in Government as well as in Private Schools shall be admitted after examining the merit of the case.
5. Age: Trainees irrespective of the age group shall be admitted.
6. Examination for the trainees shall be conducted in collaboration.
7. Admission of trainees with contagious diseases shall be strictly prohibited.
